Big-City Mayors Seek Share Of Federal Bailout

WASHINGTON (AP) - Three big city mayors asked the federal government Friday to use a portion of the \$700 billion financial bailout to assist struggling cities.

The mayors sought help with their pension costs, infrastructure investment and cash-flow problems stemming from the global financial crisis.

The mayors - Michael Nutter of Philadelphia, Shirley Franklin of Atlanta and Phil Gordon of Phoenix - made their request in a letter to Treasury Secretary Henry Paulson.

Nutter said cities are facing an economic crisis not seen since the Depression and need help just like financial institutions.

"I want to make sure that cities and metro areas are at the table, that their voices are being heard, that our challenges and problems are well understood, so that we can get relief," Nutter said.

President-elect Barack Obama has also called for some sort of aid to state and local governments so they don't have to raise taxes or lay off workers while the federal government is trying to revive the economy, but he hasn't proposed or endorsed a specific aid plan.

The three mayors proposed providing loans to help cities pay pen-

sion costs. They also want \$50 billion in loans for investment in infrastructure, and additional one-year loans to cities unable to borrow cash because of the tight credit markets.

Nutter said he met with Phillip Swagel, Treasury's assistant secretary for economic policy. He said Swagel "completely understood that we have major problems, in big and small and medium-size cities all across America and they want to be helpful. It's just a matter of figuring out what's the best way to do it and what works best."

Asked about the request, a Treasury spokeswoman referred to Paulson's statement Wednesday that assistance to local and state governments wasn't the purpose of the bailout funding.

"The focus ... is to stabilize financial institutions and strengthen the financial system, promote lending and so on," Paulson said then.

The Philadelphia pension system lost more than \$650 million in the first nine months of the year. Last week, Nutter announced Philadelphia would be laying off city employees, cutting salaries, closing most of its swimming pools and shutting nearly a dozen library branches to cope with a \$108 million shortfall this year caused by lower

business and real estate tax revenue. The deficit could grow to a total of \$1 billion over five years.

Phoenix's budget deficit is at least \$200 million and could reach \$250 million by June if tax revenues keep sliding. The figure represents up to 22 percent of the city's \$1.2 billion general fund, which pays for most city services.

Franklin said this week that city employees in Atlanta will have their hours and pay cut by 10 percent each week. The cuts are being made to help the city weather an expected budget shortfall of \$50 million to \$60 million.

Pa. Grand Jury Investigating GOP Use Of Database

PHILADELPHIA (AP) - A grand jury is investigating whether House Republican leaders illegally used a taxpayer-funded database as a campaign tool to better focus their messages to voters, a newspaper reported.

The \$9 million database in question, developed under a contract signed in 2002 by then-Majority Leader John Perzel, creates detailed profiles of individuals using a technique called data mining, The Philadelphia Inquirer reported Sunday.

The state attorney general's office is investigating the use of the database as part of its ongoing "bonus-gate" probe into whether legislative employees were improperly paid from state coffers for political campaign work.

While lawmakers for years have used state discretionary accounts to improve technology in their legislative caucuses, it is illegal to use public money or resources for campaigns.

Walter Cohen, a Harrisburg lawyer who represents Perzel, R-Philadelphia, said Friday that state investigators were looking into the database work as part of a broader review of technology contracts of both parties in the House and Senate.

In an interview Friday, Perzel told The Inquirer that neither he nor anyone in his office ever used the publicly financed database, developed by New Orleans-based GCR & Associates, for campaigns.

Perzel said the database was necessary to modernize constituent services. If a constituent calls with a request, the information is entered and tracked over time, he said.

House Minority Leader Sam Smith, R-Jefferson, also said that the database had never been used for political purposes, and that it served a legitimate government function.

In July, Attorney General Tom

Corbett charged 12 former and current House Democratic legislators and staffers with participating in a massive conspiracy to award taxpayer-funded bonuses to legislative staff who did campaign work. Since then, the grand jury probe has widened to include the House Republican caucus. No Republican has been charged.

Kevin Harley, Corbett's press secretary, declined to comment, citing grand jury secrecy rules.
