Cake "Blasts" To The Top Of Cake Contest

The rich recipe of Jennifer Klinger tempted the judges' taste buds to win the Hershey's Cocoa Classic Chocolate Cake Contest on Jan. 10 at the 2009

Pennsylvania Farm Show in Harrisburg.

Klinger received \$500 in prize money for her Chocolate Peanut Butter Blast. The Berks County native is quite a baker and also won second place in the Blue Ribbon Apple Pie contest at this year's show.

"I have been baking all week and it has certainly paid off," said Klinger.

Five judges included members of the Hershey Co., a culinary instructor, and a former Cocoa Classic winner. They evaluated 76 cakes on flavor, texture, inside characteristics, outside characteristics and frosting before narrowing it down to the top five.

Second-place honors and \$250 were earned by Suzanne Patterson of Mercer County. Gwynne Buck from Northumberland County won \$100 for third prize. Lisa Buzzard of Monroe County won fourth place followed by Diane Myers-Empson from Tioga County in fifth.

Winning Recipe:

Chocolate Peanut Butter Blast

- 3 cups sugar
- 2 2/3 cups all purpose flour
- 1 cup of Hershey's Cocoa Powder
- 1/4 cup Hershey's Special Dark Cocoa Powder
- 2 1/4 tsp. baking powder
- 2 1/4 tsp. baking soda
- 3 tsp. espresso powder
- 1 1/2 tsp. salt
- 3/4 cup vegetable oil
- 3 tsp. pure vanilla
- 1 1/2 cup boiling water

Put all dry ingredients into a large bowl and beat for 20-30 seconds. Beat eggs in a small bowl and then add to dry ingredients. Next add oil, milk and then vanilla. Beat on medium speed until well blended. Now stir in boiling water until blended. Pour into two 10" cake pans and bake at 350° for 30-35 minutes. Allow cakes to cool in pans on wire racks for approx. 15 minutes. Carefully remove from pans and cool completely on wire racks. Make filling and frosting for cakes

Filling ingredients:

- 1 cup Hershey's Reese's creamy peanut butter
- 1/2 cup butter (softened)
- 1/3 cup milk
- 4 cups confectioners' sugar
- Beat butter and creamy peanut butter until fluffy. Gradually add half of the confectioners sugar. Now add 1/4 cup milk. Add remaining confectioners' sugar and beat. Add more milk until desired consistency is met.

Additional ingredients/chocolate frosting:

- 1/2 cup butter (softened)
- 1 lb. (about 3 cups) confectioners' sugar
- 2/3 cup Hershey's Cocoa Powder
- 1/3 cup milk
- 1 tsp. pure vanilla
- Melt butter and add cocoa. Mix at low speed until blended.

Slowly add confectioners' sugar and alternate with milk. Beat at medium speed for about 2 minutes. Stir in vanilla.

Split cakes in half to make 4 layers. Place one bottom layer cut side up on serving plate and top with peanut butter filling. Cover with another layer and repeat process until all layers are used. Frost with chocolate frosting and decorate with chopped nuts, Reese's Peanut Butter Cups and Hershey's Chocolate syrup.

Aide To Former Pa. Senator Admits Pocketing \$63K

PHILADELPHIA (AP) — A longtime secretary listed as a potential defense witness in the ongoing corruption trial of ex-state Sen. Vincent Fumo admitted that she pocketed \$63,000 in state funds by padding Fumo's restaurant expenses.

Susan Skotnicki, 52, of Camp Hill earned \$103,000 after 31 years in Fumo's Capitol office, most recently as his executive secretary.

Her plea Friday in the over-billing case came as prosecutors neared the end of their three-month case against Fumo, who is accused of misusing nearly \$2 million from the Senate and \$1.5 million more from a charity and museum.

Skotnicki became at least the fourth conviction directly related to the Fumo investigation.

Two former Senate computer technicians have admitted they destroyed e-mail evidence on Fumo's orders. They're expected to testify against Fumo next week.

Political consultant Howard Cain pleaded guilty to tax evasion after investigators realized he had filed no returns from 1991 through 2006. He has since testified against Fumo.

Skotnicki submitted restaurant vouchers to the state Senate from Fumo's meals at La Veranda, a pricey waterfront restaurant Fumo frequented. Fumo maintained three house accounts there, under the names of the Senate, his campaign and his family-run bank.

Skotnicki, also known as Susan Swett, inflated or created vouchers, sometimes by copying the La Veranda letterhead. At times, she listed official dinners with more than 20 guests to justify the high tabs. The money went into a bank account jointly held by her and Fumo.

Skotnicki then tapped the bank account to pay about \$12,000 for Fumo's actual restaurant charges and to write 89 checks to herself from 2001 to 2004 for more than \$63,000, prosecutors said.
