Pa. Man Gets Over 5 Years For Workers' Comp Fraud

SCRANTON, Pa. (AP) - A man convicted of stealing nearly \$650,000 from a northeastern Pennsylvania county's workers' compensation fund has been sentenced to serve five years and 10 months in federal prison.

A judge also ordered 48-year-old Charles Costanzo of Dunmore on Thursday to pay restitution of more than \$500,000.

Costanzo administered the Lackawanna County workers' compensation fund from May 2004 to September 2007. Prosecutors say he wired funds directly from that account to his personal bank account.

Defense lawyer Joshua Lock argued during the trial that Costanzo was entitled to the money that prosecutors said he stole because they were "fees." The jury rejected that argument.

Cancer Society To Hold Volunteer Training Class

The American Cancer Society will hold a Look Good ... Feel Better volunteer training class for licensed beauty professionals on Monday, Sept. 14, from 11 a.m. to 2 p.m. at the Hanover Hospital Wellness & Education Center, 400 York Street, Hanover. The class trains volunteers to teach beauty and skin care techniques, as well as tips for disguising hair loss, to women who are undergoing cancer treatment.

Look Good ... Feel Better is a free nationwide program helping women with appearance-related side effects of cancer treatment. Workshops include instruction in skin care and makeup application; a complimentary makeup tool kit filled with donated products from the cosmetic industry; and practical tips and instruction on wigs, head coverings and nail care.

The program is offered through a partnership of the American Cancer Society; the Personal Care Products Council Foundation; and the National Cosmetology Association. Becoming a trained volunteer for this program is one way the beauty professional feels that she or he is better able to help a customer going through an extremely difficult time in their lives. Once trained, volunteers are asked to give a few hours of their time to the program every few months. Upon completion of the training the participant will receive their certification as a Look Good ... Feel Better volunteer. Previously certified volun-

teers may renew their certification by registering and attending the program from 12:30 to 2 p.m.
