Beheaded Dog, Cat, Chickens Found

PHILADELPHIA (AP) — An animal welfare official says a beheaded dog and cat found in Philadelphia appear to be the result of a ritual sacrifice.

Pennsylvania Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals director of investigations George Bengal says the dog and cat were found Friday near a bike path in Philadelphia's Olney neighborhood along with three beheaded chickens. He says he believes the animals were killed elsewhere and the remains dumped where a passer-by found them.

Bengal says there is usually an increase in ritual animal sacrifices at this time of year because of "a lot of high holidays that different groups celebrate." Most involved goats and chickens.

PA Farm Bureau's Mobile Ag Science Lab Visits MES

Pennsylvania's Friends of Agriculture Foundation, a division of Pennsylvania Farm Bureau (PFB), will be bringing agriculture education to McConnellsburg Elementary School November 23 to December 4.

Pennsylvania Farm Bureau's Mobile Agriculture Education Science Lab creates an opportunity for students to learn about agriculture (Pennsylvania's number one industry) in a fun and hands-on way

"With fewer children having a tie to farming, we created the Ag Lab to help teachers educate more students about the importance of agriculture," said PFB president Carl T. Shaffer.

Once stationed at a school, students enter the lab to perform science experiments that teach lessons focused on farm, food, fiber and the environment. Mobile Lab visits to schools are coordinated with the preparation of teachers and their classes for the science experiments. A certified teacher travels with the lab to lead each class in the science experiments. The lab is equipped with all the materials and supplies needed for the experiments.

Examples of the experiments that are taught in the lab include: germinating seeds under different conditions, creatin crayons form soybeans and testing the water capacity of different soils. A mobile lab can educate up to 900 students and involve up to 30 teachers per week.
